## Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will focus on the letter " $r$ " when a consonant sound comes first for example, br, cr, dr, gr, and tr. We continue to segment and blend sounds as well as identifying rhyming words and short vowel sounds.

In Handwriting Without Tears, we will focus on lowercase letters ' $n$ ' and ' $m$ '. These are known as diver letters which means you start at the top line and diver down and bump the lower line, swim up and over, bump the line.

In math, we continue with adding within 10 . Last week we focused on the two numbers that make up 10. Now we will be introduced to counting on using a number line.

In Bible, we will hear stories of Jesus and Nicodemus and Jesus and Zacchaeus. Our Memory verse is John 14:6, "Jesus answered, I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

We are going on a nature hike on Monday at 1 pm . We are going whether it is raining or the sun is shining. DRESS FOR THE WEATHER. We are leaving the school at 1 pm and are excited to have Mr. and Mrs. Keating and Mrs. Wilting coming with us. I wonder what signs of spring we will see???

## Grade 1

## Grade 1-Ms. Denhartog:

Bible: Our Memory work for the month of April is Genesis 1: 24. "And God said, "Let the land produce living creatures according to their kinds: the livestock, the creatures that move along the ground, and the wild animals, each according to its kind. And it was so." Memory will be tested on Friday April 26. In our Bible classes this week, we will read and learn about how the Philistines captured the Ark.

Language: In our UFLI lessons this week, we will continue learning about the role of the silent e after the letter e. In our Handwriting without tears book, we will continue to practice copying small paragraphs.

Math: In math this week, we will continue on with adding, and we will practice writing adding sentences. Keep practicing adding up to 20 !

Science: This week in our Sky Declares unit, we will finish up by talking about rainbows. We will then move on to our next unit "Behold the works of God: The earth, God's Garden". We will examine plant life, by investigating parts of plants, looking at different kinds of plants and talking about the lifecycle of a plant. They will practice caring for a plant and be challenged to understand how plants reach out in praise with all creation, to the glory of God.

## Grade 5/6 - Mrs. O'Boyle:
