## From the Principal's Desk

I frequently receive emails from organizations requesting we run a fundraiser with our students to support their cause. I understand their motivation because if we do, they immediately engage 160 people fundraising for them. The challenge is to decide what or who to support.

Several years ago, we agreed to focus our student fundraising support on two causes. In the Fall, we support Cancer research, initially through the Terry Fox Foundation and more recently through Childcan who seek to provide personalized, responsive, and compassionate programs and services to families facing the childhood cancer journey. We feel that cancer has probably affected most of our students and, therefore, they would have some understanding and meaning of this cause.

Our Spring fundraiser will be next week Monday when we have our Carnival during Christian Education Week. All the funds raised will go to EduDeo in their efforts to provide education to students in under developed countries. Each student is encouraged to bring money to spend at the carnival. We want to share the gift of a Christian education, something maybe we take for granted, with those who don't have this gift but long for it.

On Friday, Laurie Koning will speak at an assembly to help our students understand the work of EduDeo. Please ask your child about it and discuss how they might support this work through the carnival. The carnival will be fun for our students, but we don't want to lose the real reason we are hosting it - celebrating our gift of a Christin education and sharing that gift with others.

## Grade 5/6

## Grade 5/6 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Bible - We will conclude our unit on Jesus' Resurrection. Study guides were sent home on Friday. We will plan for our unit test to be on Wed. May 1st. We will begin a new unit on the Pentecost.

Language - In writing, we are working on creative story writing and editing. In grammar, we are continuing to review pronouns. To work on our reading comprehension we will look at how an author may use a compare-and-contrast text structure to write an informational text. We will also answer literally comprehension questions about the text we are reading. We will begin the next round of our children's literature battle of the books. This round will include live readings rather than recorded readings.

Spelling - Please watch your child's agenda for nightly review assignments. Our spelling tests will be on Friday May 10th.

Social Studies - We will continue our unit - From Far and Wide. This week, we will continue to look at the climate of various places in Canada, as well as look at transportation and communication systems across Canada.

## Grade 5/6

Science - We will continue our unit called Space Declares. This week, we will participate in a debate on the pros and cons of space exploration. We will also look at what makes each planet unique and how scientists study planets without visiting them. Finally, we will participate in two STEM projects: a balloon rocket (exploring how alterations affect speed and distance, discussing propulsion and Newton's third law) and a planet model (choosing a planet to research and designing a model of the planet)

Art - We will be working with plasticine to create textured landscapes. We will also begin to plan our Mother's Day creations.

Health - We dive deeper and extend our study on Mental Health. We are looking specifically at emotions and strategies to use when experiencing different emotions. We will be working on visualizing and becoming self-aware this week.
