This week the staff will travel to Redeemer University in Ancaster to the Edvance Annual Gathering. This gathering brings together over 1,300 Christian educators, leaders, and staff every October for inspiration, professional development, and connection with colleagues in Christian education.

The theme of the gathering this year is "Pursuing Joy."

"I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." Phil. 1:4-6

"Despite being imprisoned at the time of writing his letter to the Philippians, Paul is filled with joy. He uses the words "joy" or "rejoice" 14 times in this brief letter. His joy is rooted in the beautiful work he sees Jesus doing in the lives of the Philippians and in his own life through the gospel. In Paul's words, we can remain confident and joyful because we trust that Jesus will complete the good work he has begun in us. We are works in progress.

Our 2024 Annual Gathering keynote speaker, Dr. Jon Eckert, echoes this sentiment, suggesting that our school communities can also be characterized by joy. Jon, author of Just Teaching: Feedback, Engagement, and Well-being for Each Student, emphasizes that education is the profession that makes all other professions possible. By partnering with Christ, we contribute to the good work he is doing in each of his children. Jon will guide us in exploring how we can do this through a focus on feedback, engagement, and well-being." (from Edvance website)

This year we will be challenged to look into the "process" of learning with an emphasis on well-being, engagement, and feedback as the means to pursue joy in the process of learning. We will also spend time upgrading our first aid training, some of us joyfully, and those who cringe at the sight of blood, somewhat reluctantly.

As we practice our reading skills we will continue with the T/F activity and try to answer some comprehension questions in full sentences. On Wednesday, an assessment will be given on the Vocabulaire de L'automne; the balance of the period will include focussing on the "AH" sound of the "A"s in French words.

6e/7e Niveaux: Madame Van Kampen:

Current unit: Les Vêtements (clothing). We will continue to make use of the vocabulary (i.e. clothing types and accessories) as we identify what one is wearing (i.e. Je porte) and determine logical items that one would find/purchase in a variety of retail shops. A quiz is planned for Wednesday. Time permitting, we will review colours [as adjectives that we can use to describe our clothing/accessories] in their feminine and masculine spellings.

7e/8e Niveaux: Madame Van Kampen:

Current unit: Les Vêtements (clothing).

Today, a formal assessment will have occurred on the verb PORTER, unit vocabulary, and providing full sentence responses to two written questions.

We will complete written exercises to create more detailed clothing descriptions using various adjectives introduced last week (e.g. colours, patterns, fabric types, and overall styles) and continue to use the verbs PORTER, FAIRE as it pertains to "shopping" and METTRE (= to put on).
