From the Principal's Desk...

<u>Reflections from the Edvance Annual Gathering: Pursuing Joy.</u>
This year's Edvance Annual Gathering was a thought-provoking and inspiring experience, offering a wealth of insights for personal growth, teaching practice, and the challenges we face in the classroom. Several key themes emerged from the sessions and keynote addresses, many of which resonated deeply with some of our teachers. These are some of the "take aways" they shared with me.

The Balance Between Passion and Health

The keynote speaker, Jon Eckert, shared an important reminder about the tension between passion for our work and the need for balance. He posed the question: "Which category are you in—exhausting or life-giving?" It was a reflection on how even the most fulfilling work can become unsustainable if we're not careful. He shared his own experience of working 80+ hours a week because he loved his job, yet acknowledged how this passion for his work still took a toll on his overall health, family life, and joy. It was a powerful reminder that something can be life-giving and still be unhealthy if it's not managed properly. The speaker's message called us to examine the balance in our own lives: Are we struggling productively, or are we merely exhausted?

Joy as the Fuel for Struggle

Another key theme that stood out was the idea that "joy is not freedom from struggle; joy is the fuel to struggle well." This insight came from a reflection on how joy can sustain us through the challenges of our work, giving us the resilience to face difficulties with a positive mindset. As educators, we often encounter struggles, both big and small, in our classrooms and professional lives. But, as this speaker reminded us, joy isn't about avoiding struggle—it's about finding the energy to navigate it with purpose and hope. The message was clear: even in the midst of the challenges we face, we must seek to cultivate joy, as it is what fuels our passion and helps us persevere. The same is true for our students how can we help them see that there is joy in struggle and resilience helps us learn challenging concepts.

The Writing Revolution

One teacher shared their interest in a writing curriculum called The Writing Revolution that was mentioned in one of their sessions. This approach to teaching writing emphasizes structured, strategic methods to help students improve their writing skills. This teacher intends to learn more about how this curriculum and how it could be implemented in our classrooms. With the upcoming Edvance Working Group sessions throughout the school year, there's a wonderful opportunity to explore this curriculum in depth and discuss how it can be applied to benefit our students' learning.

Identity and Purpose

Finally, a powerful reflection from Henry Nouwen, as paraphrased by one teacher, reminded us of the importance of understanding our identity not in terms of what we do, what we have, or what others think of us, but in the truth that "we are beloved sons and daughters of God." This reminder resonated with many of us, offering a much-needed perspective on our work as educators. It's easy to become defined by our roles, responsibilities, and external expectations. But at the core of it all, we are grounded in a deeper sense of purpose and belonging, which can provide peace and clarity in moments of struggle. Isn't this exactly how we want our students to see themselves?!

This year's conference was both refreshing and challenging, offering valuable insights into the complex nature of our work as educators. It reminded us that joy, though not always free from struggle, is essential for our growth and resilience. It called us to evaluate the balance between our passion and our well-being, while also challenging us to think deeply about how we teach and how we cultivate joy in our own lives and in the lives of our students.

Thank you for coming to conferences and partnering with us as we seek to help build kingdom children ready to impact the world for Christ.





This week I will be in from Monday to Wednesday, as I will be covering for Mrs. Kuipers on Wednesday while she is with the Volleyball team in Dundas. Here is an outline of Grade 2's work with me for this week:

Math - Number sense: We are working on addition and subtraction with numbers to 100.

Phonics, spelling and reading: This week we will be working on the graphemes **WH**, **PH** and **NG**. Please see the homework practice sheets and spelling words going home today to help the students practice these phonics. They write their spelling words in their agendas, but please check their spelling words on Mrs. Kuipers' weekly message as well.

Social studies: This week we are looking at traditional recipes that your family might have and then move onto the traditions and holidays celebrated in Canada. Please help your child to complete the page about traditional recipes that went home today. It needs to be back at school on **Wednesday** please.

Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Last Week's Weekly Highlights -

- 1. Exploring Emotions and Peer Influence: We connected our understanding of emotions and zones of regulation from our past unit with our current unit on bullying and peer influence. Using segments from Inside Out 2, we discussed how emotions impact our actions and relationships.
- 2. Elephant Toothpaste Experiment: Using a class store-bought experiment pass, we conducted a hands-on experiment where we made elephant toothpaste. It sparked lots of excitement as we observed the effects of a chemical reaction.
- 3. Remembrance Day Poem and Poster Competition: To honour Remembrance Day, students participated in a poetry and art competition, creating meaningful pieces that reflect their respect for those who have served.

It was a week of learning, creativity, and memorable moments!

Language - In reading we will be looking at inferencing. Inferencing is the skill of drawing logical conclusions and understanding implicit meaning from context clues within a text, which we teach to help students become active, critical readers who can read between the lines, deepening comprehension and engagement with the material. In writing we will work on descriptive writing. We will learn to create vivid and engaging narratives by mastering sensory details, using "show, don't tell" techniques, selecting precise language, structuring their descriptions, and revising for clarity and impact In grammar we will be working on editing and will also go on quests to review the various parts of speech. In fluency we will be reading a text on Acorns. In phonics we will work on phonemes and graphemes. We will also be working with *Anne of Green Gables*. In spelling our next test will be on Nov. 25th. Please watch your child's agenda for nightly spelling practice activities for at home review.
