Students have already taken on "missions" to be community builders and God worshippers. The grade 6/7 class hosted hot dog lunches with the proceeds going towards ChildCan. The entire school built an altar like Jacob to bring their personal worship to God. The JK class wrote notes of encouragement to adults in their lives. The grade four class worked on saying "hello" and "thank you" to their bus drivers every day. And the list goes on.

As I step into this role, I am filled with anticipation for the growth and development that lies ahead for our school. 














INTRODUCING Mattea Casadio


JUNIOR KINDERGARTEN




vice-principal. The school and its students are in great hands with them as leaders, as well as the amazing staff that works in tandem with them.

We are so thankful that we're able to send our daughter to LCS and look forward to becoming part of the LCS Community.














INTRODUCING Lorissa & David Tenorio
