By engaging with our surroundings—by hearing, seeing, and touching—we come to a deeper understanding of how much God loves us and how much He has given for our well-being.

When we celebrate and revel in creation, we offer God the gift of joy. Think about how much joy it brings to you when you give someone a gift and they genuinely appreciate it. That's what it's like for God when we step outside, explore, and delight in the wonders He has made.

So, let's take a moment to look around us. Let's open our hearts and minds to the songs of joy that creation is singing. Let's enjoy the beauty, the sounds, and the sights that reflect God's glory and grace. In doing so, we are not only honoring His gift but also growing in our relationship with the Creator Himself.

As we engage in Creation Enjoying, we join with the heavens and all creatures in declaring the glory of God, and we begin to live out our chief purpose: to glorify God and enjoy His blessings. Let's make this a season of deepening our joy in God's creation and offering our thanks and praise for His incredible gifts.

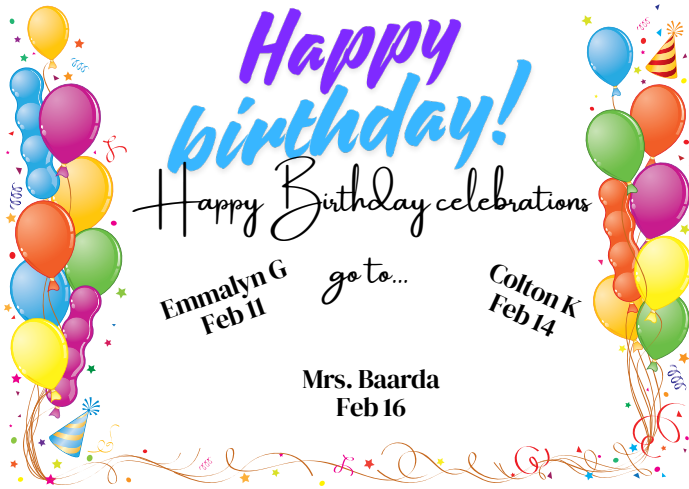

Junior Kindergarten A – Mrs. Baarda

We had a full week of school last week! This week we will not have school on Friday for a PD day.

This week we will celebrate **Valentine's Day** on Thursday, as Friday is a PD day. If you choose to send in something to share for Valentine's Day you are welcome to do so, but you do not have to. I ask that if you do, you please make sure there is enough for each child. We have 11 students in our JK class. This week we will be decorating Valentine bags as an art activity.

Our mystery letter last week was the letter **L**. We learned that lion, lemon, ladybug, ladder, and leaf all begin with this letter. We practiced making the letter L sound using the Jolly Phonics song, and we completed a search and find page for letter L. What will our mystery letter be this week?

In our **"My First Lowercase Book"** we have practiced printing the uppercase letters and now we will be getting ready to print lowercase letters by learning about small, tall and below the line lines, and then we will print letters **c** and **o**.

In **Bible** we will continue in our unit "Stories About Jesus" and read about how Jesus helps people who are sad and people who are scared.

In **math** we will begin a new unit about numbers and learn that there are numbers all around us. We will also learn about ordinal numbers and when we use them. We will continue to print numbers using the pages in our Handwriting Without Tears workbook.

This week we are completing our lessons on the sound of **C** as in cow. We will learn the high frequency word "can" and be introduced to how to print a sentence.

Grade 5

Grade 5 - Mrs. Tenorio:

It was great to see everyone back last week for a full week of school! Please continue to check Google Classroom regularly, as I'll be using it more often to post assignments and important reminders.

Bible - This week, we are starting a new unit on Jesus' ministry. We will have memory work due on **Friday, February 21, 2025**. Our new memory verse is Mark 2:17.

Language - This week, we are starting our novel study on "The Magician's Nephew" by C.S. Lewis. Each week, the students will read a chapter of the book at home, complete a summary question, and we will work on the worksheets to help with comprehension at school. For spelling, we are still completing inventory to decide which spelling groups and levels the students will be placed in. Please take some time to practice the spelling words at home, using the spelling menu, or writing sentences for each word. Additionally, please remember to bring a plastic bag for your library books to protect them from any potential damage, as we've had issues with leaking water bottles. **Library day is on Wednesday!**

Creation Studies - We are working on our posters, due tomorrow, **February 11**. After this, we will be working on an Upcycling Materials STEM Challenge. The students will bring in some materials from home and create their own item out of the recycled materials. Examples of materials to bring to school: Assorted waste materials (e.g., cardboard boxes, plastic bottles, newspapers, fabric scraps, bottle caps, old CDs, etc.). Students will brainstorm their ideas on Tuesday and Wednesday, and will bring in their materials on Thursday.

Miscellaneous: On Thursday, students are invited to bring a valentine to school. If they choose to hand out valentines, please remember to give one to every student in the class to ensure that no one is left out.
