From the Principal's Desk...

Discovering God's Order in Creation: A Call to See His Fingerprints

The Friday before March Break we had our next theme chapel with the emphasis on how we can be order discoverers. In the world of education, teachers often seek ways to help students find meaning in the world around them. For Christian educators, one profound way to guide students is by helping them see the presence of God in creation. In a science resource titled *God's Fingerprints*, written for the Prairie Association of Christian Schools by D. Barthel, D. McGillis, B. Piers, and D. VanEerden, science teachers are encouraged to help students recognize God's fingerprints throughout the natural world. However, this isn't just the work of science teachers—it's a task for all teachers.

One of the most compelling ways for students to see God's presence in creation is through the discovery of order. God's creation is not a random accident. It is full of intricate order and patterns that reflect the Creator's design. From the beginning, the creation story itself reveals God's work of bringing order out of chaos. This act of divine order is foundational not just to our understanding of the natural world, but to our understanding of the entire Biblical narrative.

The Bible reveals a creation that was made with purpose. In this context, the story of sin and redemption becomes clearer: humanity's fall plunged creation into chaos, and the work of God throughout history is the story of restoring that order. Understanding this helps students see that the world is not an accident, but rather a place where God's order reigns, even amidst the brokenness caused by sin.

An excellent way for students to explore this order is by engaging with Scripture and nature. The book of Job, particularly chapters 38–41, provides a vivid picture of God pointing out the marvels of His creation to a man struggling with doubt. These chapters challenge us to reflect on the remarkable order in the world around us, and to recognize that God's wisdom and purpose are woven into every aspect of creation.

As teachers and parents, one of the most important conclusions we can help our students draw is this: "God really had an amazing plan for all things, didn't He?"

- Biblical Insights on God's Order in Creation: Romans 1:19-20: "What may be known about God is plain to them, because God has made it plain to them. For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what
- has been made, so that men are without excuse." Psalm 19:1-3: "The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his
- hands. Day after day they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge. There is no speech or language where their voice is not heard." Isaiah 25:1 (The Message): "God, you are my God. I celebrate you. I praise you. You've done your share of miracle-wonders, well-thought-out plans, solid and sure."

As we walk alongside our students in their journey of discovery, let us help them see the evidence of God's wisdom and beauty in every part of creation. Through this lens, they will not only learn about the natural world but also be inspired to praise the Creator whose order, purpose, and plan are evident everywhere.



Finally, we will look at conductors, resistors, and insulators and answer questions such as, "What materials do you think allow electricity to flow easily?" and "Why might some materials resist the flow of electricity?"

Writing: We will be finishing our "Great Canadian Adventure" hopefully this week with a final due date of Monday, March 24 to hand in ALL work, from brainstorming ideas through all edited copies to the final copy.
