JR Kindergarten

<u> Junior Kindergarten – Mrs. Baarda</u>

As we continue in our spring unit, we will be making butterfly "mirror" art this week. We will also be planting seeds so that we can watch them sprout and grow over the next couple of weeks.

In **language** we will be coming up with words that rhyme with given words, blending and segmenting words, and listening for the beginning sounds of two words to see if they are the same, and listening for ending sounds **b**, **n**, and **d**. We will continue to practice connecting letters and their sounds.

Our mystery letter last week was letter **W**. We learned that window, wig, wagon and watermelon begin with the letter W. We learned the Jolly Phonics song for letter W, and completed a letter find page as well. What will our letter be this week?

In our **workbooks** we will be printing letters **Jj** and **Pp**, **Rr** and **Nn**, and **Mm** and **Hh**.

In **Bible** we will read about Christ's resurrection, the appearances he made afterward, and his ascension. Students are doing very well with our new memory verse! We will be learning a new song this month that we will be singing at the spring program in May.

In **math** we will be revisiting sorting and talk about what makes things the same and what makes them different.

Library day is Tuesday, please remember to send in any outstanding books that you may have at home.

Senior Kindergarten

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will be learning the difference between seeds and bulbs, planting seeds and learning about why we get rain and rainbows.

We will be reviewing the sounds of the letters that we have learned up to this point as well as reviewing short vowel sounds and reading and spelling 3 letter words.

In our **learning centers**, we are working on putting the alphabet in order, matching lowercase letters to uppercase, identifying rhyming words and sorting by beginning and ending sounds.

In **math**, we will wrap the addition up to *five* unit. We are counting to *80*. Counting backwards from *20* and printing numbers to *20*. We are really working on numbers that we tend to print backwards.

In **Bible**, we will learn about The Crucifixion of Jesus. Daily we will be learning to be Earth Keepers and learning **Psalm 24:1** as our memory verse. We are beginning to practice for the Spring Musical.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we will learn how to print lowercase "**k**" and printing words and a sentence.

This week we will plant seeds and learn what we need to do in order for them to grow. We will also learn about rain and rainbows. We will be completing a raining experiment on Friday.

During this muddy season, please continue to send layers. It gives us choices when the weather decides to be cooler or warmer.

Then, they will bring recycled materials from home to work on and design their project in class. Finally, they will present their projects to the class

Here are some of the highlights from last week...

- 1. **Bible** We explored what it means to live ready for Jesus' return, focusing on forgiveness, love, and unity in our daily choices.
- 2. **Science** We experimented with potato circuits, and although it took several tries and some problem-solving, we learned the value of grit, perseverance, and learning through mistakes.
- 3. Language In reading, we continued our *Chronicles of Narnia* novel study and even sampled Turkish delight to better understand why Edmund was so tempted—sweet insight in more ways than one!
- 4. **Writing** Students are wrapping up writing and began digitally illustrating their emoji-inspired rhyming stories to share with their Grade 2 reading buddies.
- 5. **Art** We wrapped up our texture mixed media pieces, experimenting with real textured materials to create stunning works that showcased feeling, creativity and craftsmanship.

Language - In reading, we will continue the *Chronicles of Narnia*. We will be picking up from chapter 8. In writing, we will conclude our emoji-inspired rhyming stories and illustrations. We will aim to share them with our reading buddies on Friday. In grammar we will look at coordinating and subordinating conjunctions, verb tenses and subject-verb agreements. Watch for spelling activities coming home this week in your child's agenda.

Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Bible - We will conclude our unit on Letters to the Church. Study guides will be sent home today. Unit test will be on *Wed. Apr. 9th*.

Memory Work - The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world and all who live in it. Psalm 24:1

Science - This week in Science, we're exploring static electricity through hands-on experiments using balloons, combs, and other materials to see how charged particles affect small objects. We'll also investigate how electricity is generated and try unplugged coding to control energy flow in a parallel circuit. To finish the week, we'll learn about renewable and non-renewable energy sources and where our power comes from.

Health - We will begin a new unit on Personal Safety and Injury Prevention. We will begin this week by looking at responsibilities and risks, dangerous situations and safety strategies.

Art – In art, we will be working with charcoal and working on the element of value. We will explore techniques to make realistic animals using lights and darks. *Grade 6* will work on wolves and *Grade 7* will work on rabbits.

Students are asked to pick one of the April sketch prompts or come up with their own idea to complete this week. They may complete it on any piece of paper. Their sketch is due **Thursday**. Sketch prompts are posted to Google classroom and are posted in the classroom.
