





<u> Junior Kindergarten - Mrs. Baarda</u>

It is the last week of April! We will be wrapping up our spring unit this week. We will be making some bird themed art using geometric shapes. Next week is Christian Education week, so there will be a few extra things going on at school.

The musical "Jonah's Druthers" is this week. The JK and SK students will be singing a song that we have learned about Jonah at the beginning of the program. Students can wear their "Sunday best" for the performances. There will be two performances, one on Tuesday evening, and one on Thursday afternoon during Grandparents Day. On Tuesday evening JK and SK students will go to sit with their parents after our song is finished. On Thursday afternoon we will return to our classrooms.

Thursday is Grandparents Day. Grandparents will come and visit the classrooms, have lunch with their grandchildren and watch the musical. Students are to bring in lunch for themselves and their grandparents. If grandparents are planning to take their grandchildren home with them after the program, please let the office know in advance if possible.

Friday there will be a carnival in the afternoon. Students can make a donation to EduDeo and then we will take part in the different events. The carnival is planned to be outdoors.

Please let me know if you have any questions regarding the events planned for next week.

This week in **language** we will be producing rhyming words, listening for beginning and ending sounds, blending and segmenting by first letter, and counting words in sentences. Our final mystery letter was letter **Xx**. We learned the letter X Jolly Phonics song, and talked about how we can hear the letter x sound at the beginning and ending of words. We will now be focusing on reviewing the letter names and sounds.

Most students have completed their "First Lowercase Book"! We will begin reviewing how to print upper and lowercase letters using some alphabet worksheets.

In **math** we will continue to practice counting and printing numbers one through ten. As a fun way to review colours we will be having "colour days" in JK. On **Tuesday** in JK this week it will be **Red Day**. Students can wear something red to school.

In **Bible** we are learning about the New Testament church. This week we will read more about Peter, and also about Rhoda and Dorcas. Our **memory verse** for the next couple of weeks will be **Psalm 24:1** "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who dwell in it." We also continue to practice our "Jonah" song for the play and Grandparents Day.

In **health** we will learn about the last of our five senses, our sense of touch. We will complete our Five Senses Book by drawing something that we can touch.

Tuesday is library day. Please remember to send in last week's books, as well as any outstanding books from other weeks. Have a great week!

Senior Kindergarten

Senior Kindergarten - Mrs. Heida

This week we will be working on our Mother Day surprises. I hope we can keep a secret!

We will be listening to the sound of the letter \mathbf{K} at the beginning and the end of words. We are working on reading our heart words and blending sounds together to read words.

In **Handwriting Without Tears** we are working on printing diver letter lowercase "r" . The language we use us dive down, swim up, over, stop. We will work on printing words and sentences as we review some important parts of a sentence.

In **math**, we are counting to 90, counting backwards from 20 and adding numbers between 1 and 10 using a ten frame and then a number line. We continue to work on printing numbers so that we have less reversals. Practice makes perfect.

For **science**, we are going to be looking at spring bulb plants such as daffodils, hyacinth and tulips.

We will be on the stage practicing for the **Spring Program**. Students will be performing Tuesday May 6th, 2025 at 7pm. Please bring them to the classroom dressed in their best clothes by 6:45 pm. Perhaps stop by the washroom before coming to the class. The students will also want to show you their art work that will be displayed throughout the school. You can take some time to do that at your convenience. After our performance, the students will be coming to sit with you to watch the performance of Jonah Druthers.

On **Grandparents / Grandfriends Day**, the students will get to perform for their guests after they have had lunch with them. Students are to provide lunch for their grandparents and grandfriends. Please label as much as possible in case items get left behind.
