From the Principal's Desk...

Idolatry-Discerning: Fixing Our Hearts on God's Story

"They exchanged the truth about God for a lie, and worshiped and served created things rather than the Creator ... " - Romans 1:25

Last Friday at chapel we looked at our next throughline: Idolatry Discerning. We were created to worship—but if we're not worshiping God, we're worshiping something else. In every culture, in every generation, people have wrestled with idols. They may no longer be golden statues, but the temptation remains. Today's idols are often subtle and disguised: pride, self-centeredness, greed, screens, status, comfort, or possessions. These things quietly pull our hearts and attention away from the One who deserves it most.

Throughline Focus:

We are wise about what pulls our attention and our hearts away from God's story.

Our calling is to grow in wisdom, to recognize what influences us, and to help our children discern the values and worldviews they're absorbing—through school, media, peers, and even good things that might slowly become ultimate things. Learning isn't neutral. Every subject, every story, every system carries assumptions about what's true, what's important, and what's worth pursuing. As Christians, we must learn to "read" the culture around us through a biblical lens.

At the beginning of the year you received a devotional so you could follow along with us as we went through our theme. Here are some ideas that were included in the devotional.

VERSES TO EXPLORE AS A FAMILY:

- Deuteronomy 5:7-8 Worship God alone
- 1 Kings 3:9 Ask for a discerning heart 1 John 5:21 Guard yourselves from idols
- **Psalm 119:26-32; 130:1-4** Seek God's guidance and mercy
- Proverbs 14:6 Understanding is found by the discerning
- **1 Corinthians 10:14** Flee from idolatry
- **Ephesians 4:14** Stand firm in truth **Hebrews 12:1** Throw off what hinders
- 1 Thessalonians 5:19-24 Stay aligned with God's will

QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS AT HOME:

- How do we spend our time?
- Are there objects or attitudes pulling our hearts away from God's story?
- What changes can we make?
- How can we daily remind ourselves to keep our focus on God?

These questions help us gently and honestly examine our lives and habits. Not to bring shame—but to bring clarity, wisdom, and spiritual growth.

FAMILY ACTIVITIES FOR DISCERNING IDOLATRY:

- Give time or talent to someone in need Actively love your neighbor together. Fast from distractions - Choose a day or week to step away from screens, snacks, or anything that consumes too much space in your heart.
- Donate clothing or toys Encourage kids to give cheerfully from what they value.
- Do a family "audit" Look at your calendar and budget. What do they reveal about your priorities?

These practices help refocus our hearts on what truly matters and open the door for God to reshape our values.





It will be a busy week this week!

Here are some of the highlights from last week...

Grade 6 &

- 1. *Narnia Comes to Life Through Reader's Theatre* Students brought *The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe* to life with expressive performances of "Victory at the Stone Table." This fluency activity helped build reading confidence and deepened our understanding of key themes like sacrifice and redemption.
- 2. *Electricity Board Game Project* Students have been hard at work designing original board games that teach concepts from our Electricity unit. Their creativity, collaboration, and scientific thinking have made this project a classroom favourite!
- 3. **Revelation Reflections: The Last Battle** Our Bible lessons continued in Revelation with a focus on the final battle between good and evil. Students wrote "news flash" headlines, reflected on the cost of discipleship, and created action pledges to "armor up" in their daily faith.
- 4. *Earth-Keeping in Action: Compost Game Planning* As part of our ongoing Earth-Keeping mission, students brainstormed and began designing an interactive composting game that will be used at one of the Teaching for Transformation stations this week.

Language - In reading, we will wrap up our studies of the *Chronicles of Narnia*. We will end our week with a viewing of the movie adaptation of this story. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns. There will be a comprehension test on the novel on *Wednesday*. In writing, we will continue to work on poetry. In grammar we will look at consistency in point of view. Watch for spelling activities coming home this week in your child's agenda.
