From the Principal's Desk...

FINDING OUR STORY IN THE BIBLICAL NARRATIVE

Why are we in Christian schools so concerned with "story"? Richard Kearney explains the relationship between story and identity:

"When someone asks you who you are, you tell a story. That is, you recount your present condition in light of past memories and future anticipations. You interpret where you are now in terms of where you have come from and where you are going to. And so doing you give a sense of yourself as a narrative identity ... (Kearney, On Stories, 2002)."

So, we instinctively organize our daily experience into what we believe from the past and hope for the future. As Kearney says, our identity is a narrative identity.

We also recognize that our personal narratives find deeper purpose and meaning within larger sacred stories as well. We profess belief in a Creator who chooses to reveal himself to us through the grand narrative of Scripture. As Bartholomew and Goheen, two biblical scholars state,

"Are we left with our own personal stories to make sense of our lives? Or is there a true story that is bigger than . . . us, through which we can understand the world and find meaning for our lives? Are our personal stories—apart or together—parts of a more comprehensive story? . . . the Bible offers a story that is the true story of the whole world. Therefore, faith in Jesus should be the means through which a Christian seeks to understand all of life and the whole of history (Bartholomew & Goheen, The Drama of Scripture, 2004)."

So, LCS intentionally participates in what we profess to be "the true story of the whole world." And together we continue to explore with our students how God calls us to live in that story "for such a time as this" just as Esther was encouraged to do.

There are many key motifs in the Biblical narrative that the staff and students of LCS explore together-image-bearing, covenant, culture, shalom, antithesis, sin, Kingdom, redemption and restoration. We do this through our regular devotional lives in the staff room and in our classrooms. This work can never be completed! The power of narrative is that it continues to shape us in new ways as our own personal and communal stories unfold.

At LCS we desire to invite students into the depth and beauty of the Biblical narrative and to participate in an on-going apprenticeship with Jesus Christ and what it means to be imagebearers.

We are so glad to be part of this grand story together!

This month we are focusing on Idolatry Discerning as our throughline. SK has received this mission:

Read Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister. Discover what rainbow fish thought was most important in her life. Bring a toy that you love to play with to school and let a friend enjoy it during the playroom. Complete the rainbow fish activity and share how you felt about sharing your toy.

We are going to complete this mission on Thursday May 22, 2025. We have been discussing it at school and have shared some ideas of what toys could be shared with classmates. Please help your child pick out a toy to bring on Thursday. Please feel free to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

This week we are learning about the "er, Ir and or" sound at the end of a word. It makes a different sound than when the letter "r" is at the beginning of a word. We continue to rhyme words and blend and segment sounds of a word.

In **Handwriting Without Tears**, we will focus on lowercase diver letters **h** and **b**. Please encourage proper pencil grip at home and to print letters from the top down, not from the line up.

In **math**, we are moving onto a new unit called Problem Solving and Data Management. This week we will be comparing shapes and learning how to count by **10's**.

Grade 6 & 7 - Mrs. O'Boyle:

Weekly Highlights:

Here are some of the highlights from last week...

- 1. Composting in Action! We explored potential compost bin locations around the school, using environmental checklists to assess each site. We collaborated in teams to debate the best location, and a few students even presented their top site proposal to Mrs. Veenstra for consideration.
- 2. **Writing with Purpose** We kicked off our expository writing unit! Students selected topics they knew well—from sports and pets to recycling and hobbies—and began turning their ideas into well-structured paragraphs.
- 3. Science Games Incoming! We wrapped up our electricity unit by creating review games to demonstrate our learning. On Friday, we had a blast trying out each other's games—and even enjoyed finally playing our own! It was a fun and interactive way to celebrate all we had learned in science.

Language - In reading, we will work on expressive reading and begin vocal recordings of children's stories. We will also finish viewing of the movie adaptation of the *Chronicles of Narnia* story. In writing, we will begin to work on persuasive writing. In grammar, we are learning how to become stronger writers by using correct capitalization, advanced punctuation (like colons, semicolons, parentheses, and hyphens), and editing strategies to revise our work for grammar accuracy. Watch for spelling activities coming home this week in your child's agenda.
