From the Principal's Desk...

Relationships: Jesus' Invitation to "Abiding" and Finding the Courage to Accept that

Read John 15:1-17 (English Standard Version)

Abbreviated excerpt from *Flourishing Together* (p. 76): The word meno, used extensively in John's gospel, exemplifies the kind of relationships that we should pursue and live out. Meno is usually translated with a quite old-fashioned but very meaningful word: to abide. This Greek verb has beautiful implications for our relationships, carrying the sense of "to remain, to stay, to endure." . . . Meno is . . . also used with much deeper meaning, most intensely throughout John 15, where the long-term relationship between Jesus and his disciples is explained through the metaphor of the branches (the disciples) abiding in the vine (Jesus).

In order for us in our schools to embody Jesus' invitation "to abide" we need courage.

Courage is the choice to do something that seems uncertain, sometimes unwise—at least untested—in the pursuit of a bigger picture, a future that cannot yet be seen. Courage is only really ever known in action, never just on paper. Brené Brown, author of *Dare to Lead*, is right when she asserts, "Courage is contagious."

We can give each other courage through the celebration of one another's stories. Courageous stories often tend to highlight sustenance through adversity. Remembering and celebrating them gives courage to those who hear them, whether they were part of those stories or not.

These stories confirm our calling together. This sense of shared narrative is thus often underpinned by clear habits of gratitude and rhythms of prayer.

In fact, courage is often associated with passion, a word whose meaning goes beyond high energy, activity, and pace, drawing from its Latin root passio—to suffer. While we may not seek suffering for ourselves, we know that flourishing will involve suffering. In fact if we extend this to the thought of "com-passion"—literally, "suffering together." How did you answer this question?

To expect nothing to go wrong in a school would be like seeking to cultivate a great garden without expecting storm, drought, pestilence, or weeds. In fact, the greater the challenges we face, the greater the opportunities for unearthing resources to help the community move forward. Flourishing in schools is not a solo performance, but an ensemble held together by mutual investment, care, and value. When a speaker at one of the teacher conventions shared the video of the cellist (after saying how famous he was becoming) I was struck by the fact that he was not playing alone but with others in order to make beautiful music. To the flourishing school, each educator, student, parent, board member and volunteer is precious and inherently valued. This is rarely shown through policies, mission statements, or motivational posters; rather, it is given definition in sustained, abiding relationships characterized by the normalization of acts of loving-kindness.

Thank you for letting me be part of your community for this season. For allowing me to celebrate, grieve, rejoice, give thanks, struggle, triumph, ache, and be a part of your story. It is wonderful to see God at work in Listowel and in the lives of the families at Listowel Christian School. I am praying that the second 50 years of Christian education in this community will be even better than the first 50 years.

- 1. Faith in Action: Surfboard Challenge Inspired by the story of Soul Surfer Bethany Hamilton, students explored what it means to be an Image Reflector someone who mirrors God's character in difficult circumstances. Through a hands-on art and writing reflection called the "Surfboard Challenge," and they created visual and literary reminders of how they want to respond with courage, faith, and love when life gets hard.
- 2. **Biodiversity & Living Things** In science, we explored biodiversity and what makes organisms unique. Students learned about the interdependence of living things and then put their understanding into action through a creative STEM activity—camouflaging paper butterflies around the school to demonstrate how animals use disguise to survive in their environments. - 3. **Celebrating Growth and Grit** Whether preparing for District Track and Field or supporting classmates in the classroom, students have been reminded that showing up, cheering others on, and finishing well are marks of true strength. We are so proud of how they are choosing to close the chapter with kindness, grace, and intention.
